Pursuant to the request of the Honorable Kenneth C. Patty, former Attorney General, which request was reaffirmed by you in January 1958, the undersigned has compiled an index of Attorney General's opinions rendered during the period commencing July 1, 1947, and ending June 30, 1957. No attempt has been made to reindex the opinions.

The Honorable Abram P. Staples, Attorney General, rendered the opinions from July 1, 1947, to October 7, 1947. The opinions from that date to February 2, 1948, were rendered by the Honorable Harvey B. Apperson, the Attorney General during that period. From February 2, 1948, to April 19, 1948, the opinions were rendered by the several Assistant Attorneys General. Since that date to June 30, 1957, the opinions were rendered by the Honorable J. Lindsay Almond, Jr.

The annual reports of the Attorney General cover the activities of his office during the preceding fiscal year (June 30 to July 1). The volumes containing the opinions are unnumbered, hence reference is made thereto by citing the fiscal year in which the opinion was rendered.

In addition to the subject index, there is a consecutive list of statutes referred to in the opinions.
